From the Framework document:

Together, the Five Agencies commit to ongoing adaptive management under the current Biological Opinions of the combined operations of the Central Valley Project (CVP) and State Water Project (SWP), as well as the effects of future operations under California WaterFix (CWF). This document sets forth the Adaptive Management Program (AMP) to reduce uncertainty and improve the performance of Central Valley Project and State Water Project water operations under the current Biological Opinions and CWF.
